





# Q: Can we start with a Parks & Rec update?

A: There are a number of improvements coming to area parks. At Chuck Rogers Park, repairs/renovation of the walking trail will soon begin. The trail is frequently utilized by families for walking, biking and jogging. The project will be completed by the spring of 2019. The design plans are being finalized for County Dock and the project should be advertised for bid by the end of 2018. The Parks Department has updated the landscaping and amenities in Chaplegate Park, which is a small pocket park behind the Lowe's on Old St. Augustine Road.

Greenland Park has an additional open field play area, which will allow for additional recreational activities at the heavily utilized Park. Finally, the Parks Department is working on a plan to develop a dog park in the Mandarin area. This project is still in the early stages; however, we are developing a plan for an off leash dog park that will service the Mandarin community.

## Q: What is the latest in the public works

A: The Longview Drive drainage improvements are in progress, and are expected to be completed in May 2019. Currently in the planning phase is a project to add a trail consisting of a 500-foot boardwalk and a 200-foot long natural surface trail at Palmetto Leaves Regional Park. And the expansion to the Mandarin Senior Citizen Center is anticipated to begin this month. This project will add 13,054 square feet to the existing 4,646 square foot building; it will house additional offices, a computer lab, a crafts/ceramics room, a library/conference room, an exercise room, an activities room, it will enlarge the kitchen, and create additional storage areas and bathrooms.

# Q: Do you have a safety update for Mandarin?

A: Along with the project my Rules Subcommittee is working on, creating a Complete Comprehensive Crime Reduction Inventory, the city has also created a Crime and Safety Task Force. These initiatives show that the City of Jacksonville is committed to reducing crime in all areas, not just Mandarin, and we need citizens' help to do that. Get involved, come to the Task Force meetings, and most importantly: If you see something, say something!

# Q: Do you have anything else to share with Mandarin readers?

A: I'd like to say "Congratulations" to the Mandarin Mustangs for winning the Class 8A state championship last month over Miami Columbus in Orlando to become champions of Florida's largest school classification.

Also, our hearts and prayers continue to go out to the Adams family, Mandarin, the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, and all of Jacksonville who lost a beautiful mother, wife, and dedicated JSO officer with the death of Cathy Adams in a tragic accident last month. Cathy's husband, JSO officer Jack Adams, was also seriously injured. Their two children, thank God, survived with minor injuries.

## with Duval School Board Member, District 7, Lori Hershey

#### Q: As the new chairman of the school board, what do you see as your priorities?

A: Our priorities as a board include working on building strong relationships with our partners. Also, on Dec. 18, the board was presented with a facilities report that will be analyzed to make recommendations on what to do with aging facilities, specifically older schools with population shifts. This will have little impact on District 7 schools, but we will also be looking at projected enrollment. We will be engaging the community to have an ongoing conversation regarding student needs.

#### Q: Do you have any school safety updates?

A: In November, I had the opportunity to meet with the sheriff of Pinellas County, Bob Gualtieri, who is the chair of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Safety Commission. We discussed the proposal by the commission regarding the ability of school boards to levy a half mill without referendum. This bill has not been filed, but would need to be filed by Jan. 11, 2019. The half mill would allow for funding for School Resource Officers and my question to him was if he would consider some flexibility to allow use of some of the money for other school hardening needs, such as metal detectors. We also discussed that on the commission, none of the seven largest school districts in the state are represented and how these large districts could still have a voice.

#### Q: What tools are available for parents and students regarding investigating school choice?

#### Q: What is the latest on the Mandarin Road landscaping project?



# Consolidating accounts can lead to clear financial strategy

Over the course of their lives, many people pick up a variety of financial accounts from multiple sources. They might have a few IRAs from different providers, a couple of old 401(k) plans from past employers, an insurance policy (or two) purchased many years ago, and a scattershot of stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit and other investments.

If this picture describes your situation, you may want to think about consolidating. For one thing, having a variety of accounts can run up a lot of fees. Furthermore, you'll have lots of paperwork to keep track of all your accounts, including several different tax statements. Plus, just by having so many accounts, you risk forgetting about some of them — and if you don't think you'd ever forget about your own money, consider this: Well over \$40 billion in unclaimed cash and property, including 401(k)s, pensions and IRAs, is awaiting return to the rightful owners, according to the National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators.

Consolidating your accounts with one provider can give you a centralized, unifying investment strategy, one that can help you in the following ways:

• Diversification: If you own several different financial accounts, including IRAs, 401(k)s and online accounts, you might have many similar investments within them. You might even own a cash-value insurance policy containing investments that closely track the ones you have in the other accounts. This type of duplication can be harmful, because if a market downturn primarily affects one type of

asset, and your portfolio is dominated by that asset or similar ones, you could take a big hit. But if you have all your investments in the same place, a financial professional can review your holdings and recommend appropriate ways to diversify your investment dollars. (Be aware, though, that while diversification can reduce the impact of market volatility on your portfolio, it can't guarantee profits or protect against all losses.)

- Staying on track: With all your accounts in one place, you'll find it easier to keep the big picture in mind and make the moves necessary to help you progress toward your financial goals. Two main actions include buying or selling investments and adjusting your portfolio to make it more aggressive or conservative, depending on your situation.
- Avoiding mistakes: If you own several separate accounts, you could see a loss in one or more of them and overreact by selling investments that could still be valuable to you. But with a consolidated investment platform, you can see more clearly that the impact of a loss may be small, relative to the rest of your holdings.

As we've seen, consolidating your investment accounts with a single provider can have several advantages. So think carefully about bringing everything together – you may find that there's strength in unity.



#### The John Henry Jacks House, Part 1

Built in 1887, this residence was first owned by John Henry Jacks and his family. In this part one of the story, we are going back in time to look at the history leading up to John Henry Jacks and his family building their home in Mandarin.

Originally living with his mother, stepfather, and two sisters — Francis and Letitia — in what is now downtown Jacksonville, hardships fell on the Jacks family during the 1860s. A census during that time shows both his mother and stepfather listed; however, by the time the 1870 census was conducted, the two heads of family were not found. The eldest sister, Francis, was listed as a domestic servant in a household just outside of Jacksonville, in the suburb of LaVilla. Oral history from descendants of the Jacks family tells of Francis making great efforts to try and hold the family together, supporting it after the death of their parents.

To avoid the dangers of the Civil War, Francis took it upon herself to relocate John Henry, who was 16 at the time, and their 19 year old sister to Mandarin, where they resided in the household of a family friend, John Hagan, another prominent Mandarin name. In fact, Francis even carried a matchbox-sized box with a piece of paper inside, a pledge of allegiance to the United States that she signed, in order to pass through Union Army areas of Jacksonville when getting to work. During the Civil War, Jacksonville and the surrounding parts of Duval County constantly went back and forth between Union and Confederate hands.

Francis died young, presumably from tuberculosis, never getting married or having children; her sole mission on this Earth having been solemnly placed as a caregiver for her younger brother and sister. Many descendants of this family would be named after her in honor. Meanwhile, back in Mandarin, John Henry would go on to marry Ella Eaton

of Long Island, N.Y. Letitia married William Monson of St. Augustine.

Monson served in Company D, Tenth Regiment of the Florida Volunteer Infantry, taking part in the largest battle in Florida during the Civil War — the Battle of Olustee — as well as some military actions in Petersburg, Va. Upon returning home after the war, he was engaged in the lumber industry and moved to Mandarin in 1868. He, like his father from Norway. was a skilled carpenter who is credited with having built several homes, buildings, and churches in the Mandarin and Loretto areas. Only a handful of Monson structures still stand today including the St. Joseph's Catholic Church (1891 -1912), the Winton estate - Jubilee Hall (1887), the Mandarin Store and Post Office (1911), and, finally, the home of John Henry Jacks.




# **Nutrition Check: Starting the Year off SMART**

SMART goals are an effective goal setting strategy that helps set Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic goals in a Timely manner. For example, a basic goal



would be "In 2019, I want to be healthier." This goal is hard to reach because it doesn't define what "being healthier" means to you. Vague goals can become overwhelming and often result in a sense of failure.

A SMART goal style could be either "In January, I want to consume at least two

vegetables each day" or "In 2019, I plan to limit going out to eat to less than twice per week for the next three months." Setting more specific goals sets a more realistic

foundation to complete them.

When setting your goal(s), make sure they are meaningful and clear in regard to your desired outcome. This will make achieving your goals more rewarding. More importantly, share your goals with your friends and family. Having social support may be beneficial towards completing your goal, and who knows, maybe one of them will want to join in on the

Lastly, reward yourself! The path to reaching your goals doesn't have to be a miserable one. When you have hit milestones, or are simply feeling accomplished, it's okay to schedule some "you time" or treat yourself to something you've been wanting. This can keep you motivated to set and complete more goals.

Setting SMART New Year's resolutions will ensure that the outcome is more effective and positive.

#### Winter — No worries

Preparing for winter should have been no problem, given that we know we will have at least one or two cold snaps, when our temperatures can dip into the mid to upper 20s. Twenty-four to 48 hours before low temperatures are expected, water your landscape if it hasn't rained recently (a simple rain gauge is a useful tool). The day of the anticipated overnight frost or freeze, move potted plants to a sheltered area and wrap them completely, including the pot as roots are particularly vulnerable. Cover tender landscape plants, ensuring that the covering reaches down to the ground so it can trap the warmth from the soil. Any gaps and the warm air will simply rise up and out of the covering while cold air seeps in. It's important to anchor covers if a windy night is expected (http://edis.ifas.ufl. edu/mg025). Commercial frost cloth is the ideal choice, but old sheets or blankets will do. Some of us use plastic, but it must be removed the following morning before the sun has a chance to overheat the plants; they can also suffer cold damage if the plastic has made contact with foliage.

Winter vegetables will be fairly safe, unless the freeze is more than a few hours. Brassicas — collards, cabbage, broccoli and the like — are often sweeter after a cold snap; it's certainly true of Brussels

Perhaps surprisingly, there are a number of vegetables that can be planted in January. For a detailed look at the possibilities, refer to the "Florida Vegetable Gardening Guide," http://edis.ifas.ufl. edu/vh021. This publication is a must for would-be urban farmers; even if you have only space for a small raised bed, or perhaps a large pot or two, there's every chance that vegetable gardening will grow on you. You will find recommendations of tried and true varieties in the guide, but current seed catalogs will have more information about the newest vegetables. Noteworthy catalogs include Johnny's Selected Seeds and Totally Tomatoes.

Vegetables like red-leaved mustards, Swiss chard with colorful stems, frillyleaved carrots, and various kales are attractive enough to incorporate into flowerbeds. Just make sure that if you buy vegetable starts they come from the vegetable section of the nursery, and not the flowering plant area: the latter may either have been treated with chemicals that make them unsafe to eat or are ornamental varieties simply not grown to be eaten.

We are now in Eastern Daylight Time and are restricted to using an in-ground irrigation system once a week, if needed, either before 10 a.m. or after 4 p.m. Early morning is the best choice,

as water will evaporate off of foliage during the day, reducing the chance of diseases. The use of a hose with a cutoff valve is permitted at any time, as is using a drip system — ideal for the vegetable garden — or watering can. For more information see: https://tinyurl. com/ycaxqway. There are allowances for watering more often under some circumstances, but the general rule makes sense. Our landscape plants have slowed their growth and consequently need less water. When our clocks spring forward, we will be back to watering twice a week — if needed — when our plants, including our lawns, are starting to leaf out again.

The University of Florida website Gardening Solutions is very user friendly, and if you enjoy reading about your areas of interest, be it native plants, shrubs, trees, or vegetables, you could start here: https://tinyurl.com/yct56umj. It will certainly help me to keep my New Year's resolution: to make my landscape more wildlife friendly, using native plants as well as Florida-Friendly plants (https://tinyurl.com/ yc3pt6jt) to supply food, shelter, and water for my non-human neighbors. #### Sky high fun in Sevierville

Old style leather flying helmet on my head, goggles over my eyes, and a scarf wrapped around my neck: I'm ready to take flight, feeling like Amelia Earhart and those 1920s barnstormers. Actually, I am ready for my photo op. Pilot Marc Hightower at Sky High Air Tours, based in Sevierville's Gatlinburg Pigeon Forge Regional Airport, snaps my pic.

Then he says, "If you'd like you can take off the helmet and let the wind blow through my hair." I do.

Marc instructs me about the biplane and plans for a circuitous flight over historic Sevierville, Pigeon Forge and the edge of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park. I anxiously sit in the 1927 Model 10 WACO Straight Wing biplane waiting for the miracle of flight. Marc took three-anda-half years to rebuild the aircraft, his

baby, and the engine was fully overhauled. I am more reassured knowing that he has been flying visitors in this area for the past seven years.

Headphones allow me to hear the control tower and communicate with the pilot. Air traffic controllers clear us for takeoff and this flying machine lifts


with ease on its feather-light fabric covered wings. To me, aeronautics remains a mystery, but I am tingling with glee as we ascend. I don't just feel the breeze blowing through my hair; I feel the wind beneath my wings.

Marc's voice comes through the headphones, muted yet comforting. He points out areas of interest: "There's the clock tower on the courthouse in downtown Sevierville." The spot has become an Instagram icon, beckoning people from all over the world to pose in front of the bronze statue of Dolly Parton. Dolly's consid-

ered Sevierville's favorite daughter, pretty much responsible for tourism and thousands of jobs in the region. She funds a reading program for preschool-

ers and contributed millions to nearby Gatlinburg residents who lost their homes in the 2017 wildfires.

The struts or wing supports partially obstruct my view, but I'm feeling the glorious freedom and connection with the sky, remarkably different from sitting in a pressurized cabin of a jet. We fly like birds, low and slow about 1,200 feet and 90 miles per



available for rent. We pass over the upscale Tangier Outlet Mall that attracts thousands of happy shoppers.

Taking photos becomes a challenge, but I want to document the experience. When you twist your upper body to the side, a sharp blast of air hits you. Whoa! Be sure to put the camera strap around your neck and restrain your sunglasses. Slowly, the plane circles around mist that looks like smoke rising from the mountains — the reason they were named the Smoky Mountains. Then, I get a head-on peek at Dollywood and the amusement rides. A family can have some serious fun in Sevierville.

I want to linger, but introductory biplane rides only last about 20 minutes. We fly lower as we head back toward the airport. Before long we descend and roll down the runway. My open cockpit ride is over way too soon, but I was literally blown away with my step back

> to the Golden Age of Aviation. Like Charles A. Lindbergh said, "Sometimes, flying feels too godlike to be attained by man. Sometimes, the world from above seems too beautiful, too wonderful, too distant for human eyes to see." I must agree.


